Expected Output(s): Increased engagement of civil society in the articulation of a new multilateralism founded in human development, and in national processes to accelerate the achievement of the MDGs.

## **Brief Description**

The programme seeks to strengthen civil society and civic engagement in human development and multilateralism and ensure greater citizen voice and accountability in policies and practices related to the achievement of the MDGs. The programme has two interlinked components: 1) UNDP will develop Platform HD2010 to mobilize civil society and other stakeholders to contribute to a new multilateralism that fosters civic engagement and human development. 2) UN(DP) will strengthen civic engagement in the cause of human development to accelerate the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals. To this end, United Nations Resident Coordinators in six developing countries will launch initiatives to strengthen civil society participation in planning, implementing and monitoring the MDGs and national development priorities, working closely with the UN Millennium Campaign. These countries will also be part of the wider effort of Platform HD2010 at regional and global levels to channel southern civil society voices to the emerging vision of the new multilateralism. Together, the experiences under the two components will inform a series of regional and global consultations to mark the ten-year review of the Millennium Declaration and the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the UNDP Human Development Report in 2010.

## I. SITUATION ANALYSIS

The year 2010 marks a number of key milestones in international development. It is the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the launch of the UNDP Human Development Report, the ten-year review of the Millennium Declaration and the Millennium Development Goals, as well as "Beijing + 15," on progress since the 1995 World Conference on Women. Together they present the United Nations with an important occasion to engage with civil society and to advance civic engagement, both of which are vital to the UN's human development mission. Since its definition in the 1990s as a process of enlarging people's choices, human development has focused attention on the goals of development, and is thus a precursor to the MDGs.

These reviews also take place at a time of deep questioning of the role of multilateral institutions and the UN in particular, as seen from the perspective of a myriad of stakeholders. Emerging debates on the "new multilateralism" are founded on the premise that processes of globalization have given rise to new multi-layered networks of non-state actors increasingly active in development, while also transforming the relationship between state and society. The participation of new actors — civil society, private sector, communities, local action networks, and social entrepreneurs, to name a few — is fundamental to solutions to today's development challenges and to the articulation of a revitalized multilateralism founded in human development.

Despite progress being achieved since 2007 in the majority of developing countries, the MDGs are likely to come under pressure in the current economic environment. This makes it imperative for UN(DP) to intensify its collaborative efforts with a range of stakeholders at the country level to advance progress towards the goals, especially by developing capacities in both the UN and civil society for implementation and monitoring. Here it is key for the United Nations to recognize and draw on the capacity assets in civil society for strategic partnership and skills development, strengthening south-south cooperation.

## II. STRATEGY

UNDP will mobilize Platform HD2010, as a forum to develop a vision for the next decade that actively involves a range of civil society actors for an outward looking multilateralism reinforcing civic engagement and human development. UNDP envisages the platform as a space in which it can engage with civil society actors at multiple levels and areas to generate critical debate and perspectives on the emerging vision of an inclusive multilateralism, governance and accountability, and civic engagement in human development and the Millennium Development Goals.

Platform HD2010 has a two-fold, interlinked objective. One is to engage a wide range of non-state actors, including civil society those at the community level and representing marginalized groups, in articulating a new vision of multilateralism that is anchored in human development and inclusive participation. The second is to renew strategic and practical opportunities for civil society to contribute to MDG processes at the local and national levels. In pursuit of these two goals, Platform HD2010 will seek the participation of a wide range of non-state actors, such as indigenous peoples, youth, minorities, peasants' movements, and women's, community-based and faith-based organizations in making the human development paradigm and MDGs more effective and operational in the emerging structures of global governance. In light of Beijing+15 in 2010, women's groups will be involved in the intellectual exercise of constructing a 'new multilateralism' and in concrete participatory efforts to advance the MDGs at national and regional levels.

Platform HD2010 will seek to:

- 1) Increase the voice of citizens and civil society organizations in the human development approach and MDG-related policy and practice, particularly at the national level.
- Support UN Country Teams in strengthening civic engagement and human development, using the MDGs as an entry point.
- 3) Provide citizens' inputs from national MDG processes to the MDG 2010 Review.

- 4) Strengthen relations and policy dialogue on a range of development issues, including the emerging vision of multilateralism, between the United Nations, citizen groups and civil society.
- 5) Increase the participation of civil society in the South in global networks.

## Specific activities include:

- 1. Strengthen citizen participation in national MDG-related processes and human development: The programme will support initiatives in <u>six countries</u> (in different regions) to equip the Office of the Resident Coordinator and United Nations Country Teams (UNCTs) with innovative tools and partnership strategies in strengthening civic engagement in specific aspects of MDG policy and practice, working closely with the UN Millennium Campaign.
- 2. <u>Document results</u>: This will consist of i) a consolidated report, documenting the process and results of civic engagement initiatives in these countries, to make a useful and much needed contribution to the existing literature on implementation of the MDGs; ii) case studies exploring the integration of civil society in South in global networks and the extent to which the UN is engaged in this process (three months). The goal will be to enhance citizen voice in MDG processes at the national and regional levels and create spaces for articulation of civil society local and national perspectives to the emerging vision of an inclusive multilateralism.
- 3. Convene Platform HD2010: Platform HD2010 will engage a wide range of non-state actors, including women's organizations, those at sub-national and local levels and those representing marginalized groups, to contribute to the emerging vision of multilateralism. A sequence of events is envisaged marking the 20th anniversary of the Human Development Report, the MDG+10 review in 2010, and the 2015 MDG horizon. Events will include national, regional and global consultations, seminars and papers, involving academics, civil society representatives, development experts stimulating and energizing a dialogue at multiple levels. Conceptual papers on the MDGs, human development and multilateralism, and the documentation of civic engagement initiatives will be a key part of these activities. Key lessons learned and recommendations from the national level experience of civil society engagement in key MDG policy and practice (drawn from documentation) will be shared in a global meeting planned for 2010.

## Outputs\*

- 1) Action plans in each of the six countries detailing evidence-based advocacy and civic engagement to advance the MDGs.
- 2) Increased engagement of civil society in national MDG policy processes, supported by the United Nations and building on the work of the UN Millennium Campaign and other actors
- 3) Documented results of citizen engagement in MDG policy and practice at the national level, including civil society-led 'shadow' reports.
- 4) Recommendations relating to citizen and civil society participation in and influence on MDG policy and practice, including UN-civil society engagement mechanisms and strategic alliances.
- 5) Case studies on the extent to which civil society in the South is integrated in global networks and the role of the UN system in this process.
- 6) Conceptual papers and recommendations on a new multilateralism founded in human development, with an enhanced role for non-state actors.
- 7) Background papers that could feed into HDR2010.

## External:

- Implications of the global financial crisis on resource mobilization for UN(DP) work with civil society
- Ability of UNDP to attract representative and influential civil society actors in substantive partnership

The programme envisages a number of measures to mitigate these anticipated risks: *Internal*:

- Improving staff capacity for civic engagement and partnership; this includes guidance notes, learning and training tools and streamlined and improved procedures for engagement
- Expanded efforts to increase UN(DP) knowledge base of civil society through independent assessments
- Recruitment of a national specialist based in the Resident Coordinator Office (except in Bangladesh and Philippines where the UN Millennium Campaign already has such a person jointly appointed with the RC in the RCO) who will move country-level interventions forward, ensuring linkages with the UN.

## External:

- The Platform HD2010 initiative will serve as a vehicle to actively engage and partner with civil society networks in strengthening the role of the UN in the context of the current global crises and evolving debates on the nature of multilateralism.
- Substantive partnership development with CSOs to tap capacity assets and ability to serve as expert resources.
- Strengthened UN- civil society relationship at the national level, with increased collaboration in policy dialogue

## Country selection and criteria

National level activities will be in countries covered by the MDG Achievement Fund. Two other minimum requirements will be strong support and leadership from the Resident Coordinator for civic engagement in UN development efforts the presence of active civil society. Additional important criteria in choosing countries will be: active efforts by the UN Millennium Campaign in involving civil society in MDG processes, advocacy efforts supported by the MDG Fund, UNCT support, and the presence of UNCT civil society focal points and national civil society advisory committees to UNCT. Where UNV have a National Programme Officer, within the six countries, linkages will be established to synergise efforts.

Balance will be sought across Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Arab States region, and between Least Developed Countries and Middle Income Countries, with a stronger emphasis on Africa.

# V. MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

The main partners in the implementation of this programme are the UNDP Civil Society Division, based in the Partnerships Bureau, the Office of the Resident Coordinator in participating countries and the UN Millennium Campaign. The Civil Society Division/Partnerships Bureau will be responsible for managing the budget. The division will work with the UN Millennium Campaign, and the HDR Office at the global level to ensure overall coherence and quality of outputs, as well as with UNV where there is a national Programme Officer in the 6 selected countries. Decisions and oversight will be the responsibility of the project steering committee (composed as indicated in chart below).

It is proposed that the project steering committee will:


- Approve total funding to be allocated to the RCOs
- Agree on road map of initiatives and activities from June 2009 December 2010
- Meet twice a year (virtually if needed) for updates and decisions
- Review annual reports on the progress of activities and achievement of results
- Ensure overall quality control, coherence of activities and outputs of the programme
- Provide substantive support and guidance

## National level actions:

Country-level activities will be led by the RC on behalf of the UNCT, in partnership with the UN Millennium Campaign.

Once the overall allocation per country is made by the global Project Steering Committee, national-level work plans and detailed budgets will be approved in-country by the RC and the UN Millennium Campaign. Recruitment of the national coordinator, approval of work plan and progress reviews will also be carried out by the RC and the Millennium Campaign. Disbursements to RCOs will be made in two tranches by the CSO Division, the second on approval of the Millennium Campaign, in its capacity as member of the Steering Committee.

The UNCT (including civil society focal points and national civil society advisory committees, where applicable) and UNVs (where there is a national Programme Officer) are expected to be actively involved at the national level, and UNDP Regional Centres at the regional level. Where relevant, country-level interventions will complement the advocacy and communications efforts of the MDG Achievement Fund. The MDG Achievement Fund will be responsible for monitoring and evaluation.



# VI. MONITORING FRAMEWORK AND EVALUATION

In accordance with UNDP programming policies and procedures, the project will be monitored through the following:

## Annually

- Annual Review Report. The Annual Review Report of the overall programme shall be prepared by the Project Coordinator, CSO Division/Partnerships Bureau, in consultation with the Millennium Campaign, and presented to the MDG Achievement Fund at the end of the year and no later than 31<sup>st</sup> December. The report shall focus on the extent to which progress is being made towards outputs, and that these remain aligned to appropriate outcomes.
- At the country level, the accountability and review process will be supported by an oversight group made up of representatives of CSOs and the UNCT. These country-level reports will feed into the Annual Review Report.

## II. ORGANIZATIONAL CONTEXT

The Civil Society Division in the Partnerships Bureau of UNDP works to actively support and promote substantive engagement and partnership with civil society. The Division works to empower UNDP staff to engage more effectively and strategically with civil society. As part of such strategic engagement, and to mark the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the UNDP Human Development Report in 2010, UNDP is launching an initiative to strengthen civic engagement for MDGs and contribute to the emerging vision of a new multilateralism founded in human development. The two-year programme will have two components: 1) mobilize civil society perspectives and networks to contribute to a revitalized multilateralism with an an enhanced role for non-state actors; and 2) support initiatives in six countries (in Asia, Africa, Latin America and Arab States regions) to equip the Office of the Resident Coordinator and United Nations Country Teams (UNCTs) with innovative tools and partnership strategies in strengthening civic engagement in specific aspects of MDG policy and practice. Working under the supervision of the Director of the Civil Society Division, the Programme Specialist will liaise closely with the United Nations Millennium Campaign, UNDP country offices and regional

centres, as well as key civil society networks from national to global levels in managing programme and project aspects of the initiative.
III. FUNCTIONS / KEY RESULTS EXPECTED

## BACKGROUND

The UN Millennium Campaign, an inter-agency initiative hosted by UNDP, encourages and supports citizens' efforts to hold their governments to account for the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). The Campaign's Africa regional team works with citizens in key constituencies - civil society organizations, parliamentarians, local authorities, youth, media and the private sector. The Campaign focuses its work on MDGs 1-7 primarily in Ethiopia, Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda, Burkina Faso, Ghana, Nigeria, Senegal, Mozambique, Zambia, and Malawi.

## 2. ORGANIZATIONAL CONTEXT

Under the over-all guidance and supervision of the Resident Coordinator and Deputy Director, Africa of the UN Millennium Campaign, the national Millennium Campaign Coordinator will be located within the Office of the RC and work closely with the UNCT.

The principal role of the national Millennium Campaign Coordinator will be to design and implement the national MDG Campaign Strategy and Joint Plan of Action between the UNCT and the UN Millennium Campaign. The role includes driving key policy advocacy initiatives as well as to support the UN inter-agency collaboration and public and media outreach within the country on the MDGs. The national Millennium Campaign Coordinator is required to become knowledgeable of the MDG status and national Government's MDG policies, the UNCT's work on the MDGs, the UN Millennium Campaign's work in the country and key partners at the national and local level. More specifically, the successful candidate has to understand critical socio-political issues facing the country and MDG progress in the national and local context.

# 3. DESCRIPTION OF RESPONSIBILITIES: FUNCTIONS/KEY RESULTS EXPECTED

- 1. Based on a careful assessment of the social, economic and political context and opportunities, carefully design, coordinate and implement the national MDG campaign and advocacy strategy and Joint Plan of Action, focusing on achievement of the following results:
  - Actively support strategic coalition building and advocacy with various constituencies ranging from grassroots and community-based organisations to parliamentarians, local governments, youth, faith based organisations etc. at the national and local levels.
  - Promote and operationalise advocacy and campaign strategy in the country

  - Identify key campaign events and advocacy tools to promote necessary policy change for the achievement of the MDGs.
- 2. Planning and design of strategies for communications and media outreach:

- 3. UN Inter-Agency Collaboration and Partnership with Key Constituencies on the MDGs
  - Strengthen inter-agency collaboration, particularly with various UN specialized agencies and UN Country Team, working with all relevant focal points and UNCT Groups in order to implement MDG campaign Joint Plan of Action.
  - Ensure high quality delivery and accountability.
  - Explore further sustainable partnerships with civil society, Parliamentarians, local Governments, youth, media etc. for the achievement of the MDGs and to raise public awareness of MDGs.
  - Coordinate with the communication team members of the UN Millennium Campaign and the UNCT (including the Communications Group) in the development of strategic and organizational policy and communication tools to advocate for the achievement of the MDGs.

## 4. KEY RESULTS EXPECTED

- MDG Campaign Strategy and Joint Plan of Action designed and executed;
- Increased and regular exposure of the MDGs and the MDG Campaign through coordinated and sustainable alliances with media and through systematic release of news articles and feature stories using Quad Media (TV, radio, print, and internet) and events management to promote the MDGs as a key element of the UN's efforts to "Deliver as One";
