PROGRAMMATIC BRIEF

The MDG-F financed **20 joint programmes** across Asia and the Pacific region countries, for a global amount of **US\$ 112.3 million.**

Joint programmes were developed in **7 countries** of the region: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Cambodia, China, the Philippines, Timor-Leste and Vietnam.

The countries receiving the highest programmatic budget from the total amount invested in the region were: China (4 programmes and US\$ 30.4 million), the Philippines (4 programmes and US\$ 23.1

million), Bangladesh (2 programmes and US\$ 16.1 million) and Afghanistan (3 programmes and US\$ 13.6 million). Please see Figure 1 for further details.

The **thematic windows** that canalized the highest share of resources for the region were Children, Food Security and Nutrition (7 programmes and US\$ 33.2 million), Environment and Climate Change (3 programmes and US\$ 24.8 million), Gender Equality and Women Empowerment (3 programmes and US\$ 17.4 million), and Youth Employment and Migration (2 programmes and US\$ 12.5). JOINT PROGRAMMES COVERAGE IN THE REGION

Overall, it is estimated that more than **2,185,000** individuals (2,185,187) were directly supported by MDG-F programmes developed in countries of Asia and the Pacific region. Among these individuals, MDG-F programmes reached a total of **1,037,580** women, youth female and girls (48.5% of the overall total of citizens).

Programmes involved and benefited **62,900 youth** (51.5% were youth female) and more than **500,000** boys, girls and students (507,906). Mainly by the means of food security and nutrition programmes, more than 450,000 children were reached (450,365). Nearly **29,000 civil servants** were part of capacity building activities (28,996). In countries of Asia and the Pacific region, programmes also engaged: **9,105** health workers, **5,456** farmers and food producers and **3,196** entrepreneurs and culture professionals (artisans, artists, etc).

Of the above mentioned **2,185,000** right holders and 1,344,077 agents, were reached by actions promoted by Children Food Security **Nutrition** and programmes; 440,554 citizens were reached by Youth. **Employment** and Migration initiatives

161,780 with initiative belonging to the **Gender Equality and Women Empowerment window**. More details are presented in Figure 3 below.

Capacity building is a core characteristic of all joint programmes financed by the MDG-F. In the programmes financed across the 7 countries of Asia and the Pacific, participation in these activities included **274 Civil Society Organizations** (CSOs), **5,697 local institution**, **188 national public institutions**, 2,154 schools, 113 communities, and **166 Community Based Organizations** (CBOs). The programmes also strengthened the capacities of **5,538 private sector institutions**, mainly small and middle enterprises, cooperatives and business units.

Joint programmes in countries of Asia and the Pacific provided services that spam from capacity building to nutrition, from food production to access to justice. By clustering the provision of services into different families, we can estimate that: 507,289 children and mothers were reached by programmes aiming to improve their

nutrition and health. Services to migrants and their families reached overall 369,024 citizens. 30,735 citizens were involved in food production and agriculture initiatives. Provision of infrastructure, especially access to water and sanitation benefited 174,762 people. Health services, including reproductive health, reached 130,072 people.

Awareness rising touched more than 690,000 citizens. In addition, the programme for Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment in Bangladesh has reached 2.5 million individuals mainly by a nationwide awareness campaign on gender based violence.

POLICY INFLUENCE IN THE REGION

Across the 20 programmes developed in the region, the MDG-F has supported or promoted the approval or implementation of **67 national and 107 local policies**, **31 national laws and 64 national plans**, plus 88 local plans and 41 local legislations.

Millions of citizens have been affected by policies, laws and plans promoted via MDG-F joint programmes.
