<b>In Brief:</b>	Poor producers in Bolivia generate 83% of employment but barely 25% of GDP. This economy includes successful experiences with fair trade, organic and similar, which can be repeated with the collaboration of public and private stakeholders who promote technological innovations, added value, social and gender inclusion, and access to markets. The programme will speed up these processes in the Bolivian Altiplano, the poorest region, as a better option for generating income and employment in the midst of the global crisis, because they are part of a dynamic segment of indigenous producers linked to value chains of inelastic demand. It will strengthen national capabilities in the management of public policies for the productive territorial development; it will promote the coordination between initiatives with a high added value and certification, technology and trade services; and it will boost innovative financial mechanisms that facilitate the access to new internal and external markets, and channel surpluses into productive diversification.		

#### Outcomes:

- Institutional capabilities in the country are strengthened for the design and implementation of public policies for ecological production.
- 100 rural communities are in the middle of an ecological certification process, which increases their production and income.
- At least 30% of the direct beneficiaries of the Joint Programme have had access to financial services for the production, transformation and access to national and international markets.
