In Brief:	<p>The aim of the programme is to prevent violence and promote citizenship in Brazil, following the concept of Citizen Safety (Segurança Cidadã –CS Approach). This approach has been implemented in several countries in Latin America and highlights the importance of adopting a multidisciplinary strategy to prevent violence, taking into account that it usually has various causes. The actions in the different sectors will be adapted to the local needs. This programme strengthens the joint work carried out by the UN organizations, the government and NGOs, improving the experience in the management of joint projects and optimizing the implementation of activities integrated in this field, focusing on the prevention of violence. The programme will be implemented in three communities, selected according to the level of urban violence and the potential sustainability. The local plans will be created in collaboration with local stakeholders and new methodologies will be designed, tested and communicated over the country, thus contributing to the design and implementation of national public policies.</p>

- Reduction of violence and its effects on childhood, adolescence and youth in a vulnerable situation.

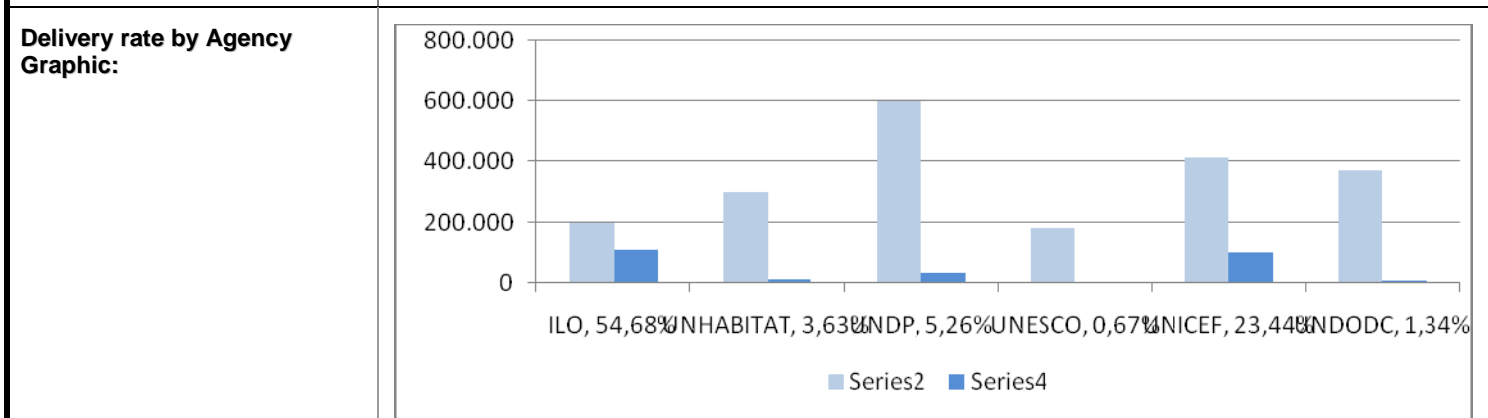

Main Achievements:	The JP decided to use an open bid to define the intervention municipalities. The aims were to ensure ownership of the project by the local authorities and to mitigate the risks of an election year. However, the process has been delayed almost a year and the three municipalities were not defined until June.
