In Brief:	The Inter-agency Programme for the Promotion of Gender and Ethnic-Racial Equality aims to support the Special Secretariat of Policies for Women and the Special Secretariat of Policies for the Promotion of Racial Equality of the Brazilian Government in the design, implementation and follow up of National Plans for Policies for Women and for Promotion of Racial Equality, as well as civil society organizations involved in monitoring and evaluating them. The following agencies of the United Nations System presented this proposal together: UNIFEM, UNICEF, UNFPA, UN-HABITAT, UNDP and ILO. The aim of the programme is to ensure gender and racial equality, with a twofold approach in the design, implementation and monitoring of public policies, reinforcing the citizenship of women – especially black and indigenous women – while promoting the equal access to potentially available goods and services, and it fosters social mobilization and participation as crucial factors to achieve fair human development.		

Outcomes:

- Mainstreaming of gender dimensions in public policies, programmes and services, extended and improved.
- Strengthened and integrated local and regional capabilities to promote gender equality.
- Egalitarian, plural and multi-racial participation of women when making decisions.
- Contents on the promotion of gender and racial equality assessed and introduced in the media.
