In Brief:	<p>The Programme aims at eradicating all forms of gender-based violence (GBV), in Colombia via an integral and inter-sector strategy that acts in the areas of prevention, detection, recording, attending and promoting an appropriate political and legal framework in accordance with international instruments available. Special attention will be paid to violence against women, especially to those in the most vulnerable conditions: indigenous, Afro-Colombian, displaced and victims of human trafficking. Exposing the violence endured in the armed conflict will be a priority. UNIFEM, UNFPA and the IOM will execute the Programme, in collaboration with the UNS Agencies that are part of the Inter-Agency Gender Committee, national and local public institutions –the legislative, executive and judicial powers and control bodies– and civil society organizations –especially women organizations and the Media.</p>		

Outcomes:

- It has contributed to the prevention, detection, recording and monitoring of GBV, especially against women.
- It has improved the quality of both the national and local services attending to GBV.
- It has contributed towards the development of a political and legal framework for GBV in accordance with international instruments.
