In Brief:	The programme will continue to improve the economic and social opportunities available to young men and women living in social, economic, gender, territorial and cultural inequality, by means of the inclusion of young people in the labor market through the promotion of suitable work and economic undertakings; promoting the structured, local execution of national youth employment policies, along with socio-economic inclusion and migration policies focused on the economic, social and cultural rights of young people; and strengthening the systems protecting the rights of young people and the governability of public policies backed by participation of young citizens. This intervention will enable progress in MDG 8, to provide young people with access to dignified and productive work and in achieving the MDG, focused on promoting gender equality. The programme's main partner will be the National Secretariat for Migration.		

Outcomes:

- Greater inclusion of young people in the labor market, considering the economic potential of the intervention provinces, via suitable work and individual, family and associational economic undertakings.
- The national youth employment and youth migration policies executed in a structured manner locally and tackling the structural causes of migration and inequality.
- Strengthening of systems for the promotion and protection of the rights of young people, focused on workers' rights and socio-economic inclusion.

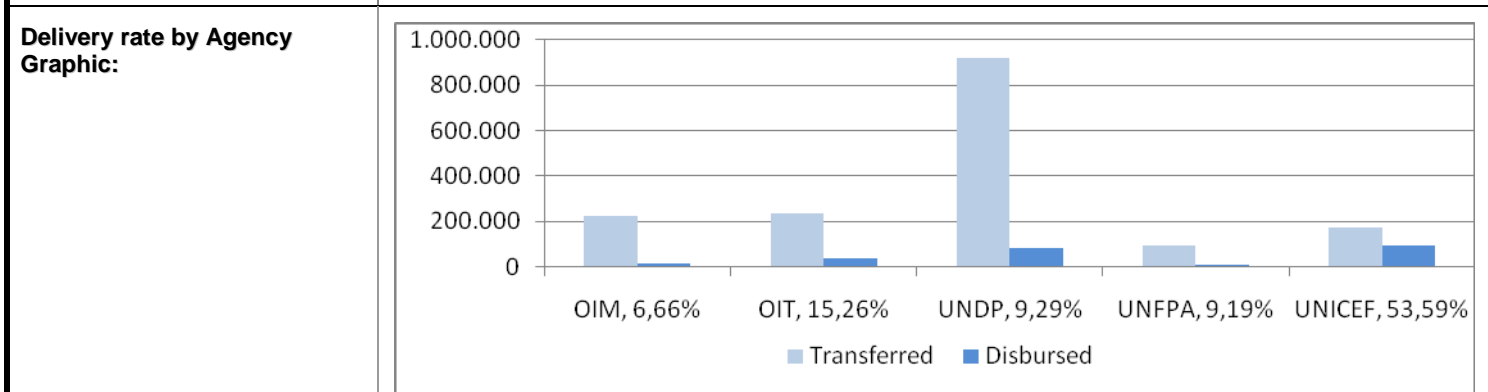
