In Brief:	<p>This United Nations joint programme (2008-2010) intends to assist and strengthen the Secretaría Presidencial de la Mujer (Presidential Secretariat for Women) and the Defensoría de la Mujer Indígena (Office for the Defense of Indigenous Women) in their efforts to institutionalise the “National Policy for the Advancement and Development of Guatemalan Women” and its corresponding Implementation Plan (2008-2011).</p> <p>The programme also aims at strengthening the state institutions that have been prioritised for implementation in the Plan and specifically in the areas of violence against women, economic empowerment and political participation. At the same time, the programme will promote the empowerment of women and adolescent girls and their organizations, and their capacity to develop proposals and processes of social auditing, thus contributing to the institutionalisation and implementation of the public policy. At the local level, the programme will be implemented in seven departments selected for their demographic characteristics and levels of development. The combination of participating Agencies will ensure specialized multidisciplinary support.</p>		

Outcomes:

- Strengthening the capacities of SEPREM, as steward and advisor of public policies for the advancement of women, and DEMI, as the defender of indigenous women rights, to ensure the incorporation of the National Policy on the Promotion and Development of Guatemalan Women in the planning and implementation of public entities at the national and local level.
- Strengthening the main national institutions and local governments that are responsible for the implementation of the policy, especially in the areas of violence against women, women’s economic empowerment and their increased social and political participation.
- Strengthening women’s leadership and their organizations and women government officials, to influence the development of strategies to promote the institutionalization of the policy by local Governments and develop effective social audit processes.

Main Achievements:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Firma de acuerdos con 11 instituciones del gobierno para el cumplimiento de los compromisos gubernamentales relativos a la política nacional de promoción y desarrollo integral de las mujeres. Al fortalecer la presencia de la DEMI se ha logrado superar el incremento de un 140% de atención de casos de violencia, discriminación y racismo contra las mujeres. Fortalecimiento de la coordinación interinstitucional y la implementación de acciones estratégicas conjuntas entre SEPREM y DEMI 																													
Other important achievements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mediante el fortalecimiento institucional de SEPREM y DEMI se ha conseguido aprobar el Decreto 22-2010, Reformas al Código Municipal: obliga a los municipios a destinar el 0.5% del presupuesto para la Comisión de la familia, la mujer y la niñez, y a crear Oficinas Municipal de la Mujer. La incorporación de los emprendimientos de las mujeres al Sistema de Información Territorial de SEGEPLAN permite fortalecer los procesos de diseño o mejora de las políticas económicas del país considerando esta contribución Las redes de emprendedoras han sido impulsadas por los CSEMs: identificación de las rutas de las cadenas de valor a nivel territorial y formación e intercambio de experiencias. La organización de encuentros, foros y ferias ha permitido la expansión de sus mercados y la diversificación y mejoramiento de sus productos. Conmemoración del Día de la Mujer y apoyo a la Campaña Global UNETE Aportes e inclusión del fortalecimiento a las políticas de equidad de género y cero tolerancia al abuso y el acoso sexual en el trabajo en Gobernando con la Policía Nacional y el proceso de reforma policial. Convenio para la documentación de las mujeres con el RENAP Los siete departamentos cuentan con CSEMs instalados, funcionando y elaborando planes para la incorporación de la emprendeduría femenina en los planes locales de desarrollo territorial.
