In Brief:	<p>Through a solid collaboration arrangement between five UN agencies and the UN Peacekeeping Mission, the Joint Programme will tackle the immediate causes of violence in 10 communities particularly prone to violence in Haiti by supporting violence prevention strategies, thereby providing a breathing space for longer term recovery and development efforts to take hold.</p> <p>To support these local level efforts and to ensure a sustainable and comprehensive response to violence in Haiti, the programme will also promote a more systematic integration of violence and crisis related considerations into development policies and other responses by the national government. It will achieve this by strengthening the capacities of local and national institutions to gather, and analyze violence and crisis related data, with a view to producing and sharing credible analysis to improve the impact of programmes and policies on the dynamics of violence, including from the national government.</p>		

Outcomes:

- Local and institutional capacities to Prevent Violence and Promote Peace (PVPP) are strengthened, and the Cantonal Security Index (CSI) is improved in nine cantons in the country.
- Conditions become more favourable for the creation of education and recreational opportunities, protective environments and safe spaces for children, adolescents and young people.
- In the selected cantons, the skills required to engage in dialogue and the ability to resolve conflicts are improved.



Regions of Intervention:	Port-au-Prince (Cité Soleil, BelAir, Carrefour-Feuille), and larger cities such as Gonaive and Cap Haitien.
