In Brief:	This programme seeks to promote employment and microenterprises for young people and to manage their migration through more and better job opportunities to secure decent work. To achieve this, a National Policy for Youth Employment and institutional strengthening of the Ministry for Work are needed, especially its Public Employment Service, the National Directorate of Employment and the Regional Directorates. Through them, and in alliance with regional governments, other public offices and the private sector, the programme will focus on young people in order to: a) increase the coverage and the efficacy of the job placement, b) channel better information about the labor market, and c) manage labor migration and provide technical assistance to MSEs. It will also focus on young women to ensure that their entry into the labour market is compatible with their reproductive role. Young people will have a promotional framework and strengthened institutions that will reduce their rates of urban unemployment and inactivity.		

Outcomes:

- A National Policy for the Promotion of Youth Employment and the strengthening of public sector institutions to increase job opportunities and improve working conditions for young men and women.
- Youth labor intermediation through the public employment service (DNPEFP and DRTPE), strengthened and modernized so as to improve job opportunities for young people and reduce youth unemployment, especially among young women, both nationally and regionally.
- Public management of international migration of youth labor via institutionalized labor intermediation, national and regional, strengthened and extended.
- A framework for the promotion of youth micro and small enterprises, including the productive use of remittances, now created and in operation.
